

Hans van Riet, Graduate

Hans was born and raised in the Netherlands. He moved to Southern California to venture into a career in television production. Since that move, he has worked on many U.S. network shows as an editor, and has made a place for himself as a television director. The latest show he directed is the daytime game show Pictionary, which currently airs on weekdays on FOX affiliates.

He was "not much of a learner" when he was young, so he never finished a college degree, despite many university-level courses. He decided to change that in 2020, just before the pandemic hit, and completed an AS degree in film, television, and electronic media at his local community college. He enjoyed the process, and decided to raise the bar by joining Cohort 14 at Cal Poly Humboldt in 2022. His primary motivation was to finish a degree, but he's also a "proponent of lifelong learning," and the Leadership Studies program was an "excellent fit" for his busy career.

He says, "Due to my industry's obsession with ratings, I really enjoyed the Data-Driven Leadership course. Still, all courses add to more profound thinking about the role of a leader and the interaction between leadership and employees. The cherry on the cake was the excellent upper-division GE classes that Humboldt has to offer and that I was able to fit into my curriculum with the help of the program's academic advisor, Betsy Rogers."

The program has sharpened his communication skills, and he has become a more emphatic leader, or as one of the professors calls it, "a humanistic leader." Hans says, "The beauty of this program is that everything you learn immediately applies in practical situations; it's not just theoretical."



A bachelor's degree was his end goal when he started the program. But he says that "this has been such a stimulating and motivating experience" that he is now pursuing a master's degree. He hopes to use his experience and academic knowledge to "entertain future generations or teach them how to entertain others."

Here are his takeaways for successful completion of the Leadership Studies program: "Reach out to your professors when you have a question; they are here to help. Create a relationship with your fellow cohort students; together, you're stronger. Schedule your school tasks to fit into your schedule and stick with that schedule. Do not procrastinate, and finish all your assignments. View this as a learning opportunity; go beyond just passing your classes. Use the support from the academic advisors. Do not despair if it feels hard at times. You will get through it."

Claudine Bibeau-Parks, Student

Claudine is a degree completion student set to graduate spring 2024, the same time as her son, who is a student at UCLA!

Claudine transferred to Humboldt for her senior year and found the program to be the missing piece in her professional trajectory. It included everything she was missing in her business career.

When asked what was the most significant course or signature assignment in the Leadership program, she replied, "Utilizing my report within my department at work to enact real change already speaks volumes about the program. Skills you learn that can immediately be put to use and see results, not years later."

Since starting the program, she says, "My confidence is being shown to me as I complete each semester. It's the foundation for me to be brave and venture out into new territory, personally and professionally. I've learned how to be a competent and compassionate leader who lifts as she climbs."

She plans to go into a masters program focusing on student

affairs in higher education and earn a certificate in grant writing for nonprofit educational groups. She says, "I don't think I'll ever take a break from education, there is always something new to learn!"

To incoming Leadership students, she says, "Allow the difficult spots in the process to change you and expose you to true leadership. Leaders are not born; they learn and put in the work."

The Equine Assisted Services & Therapies program is a series of experiential courses that combine online and hands-on learning in a therapeutic equine setting. The goal is to teach students in education and health-related fields how to add an equine component to their work. Equine welfare, professionalism, and safety are emphasized throughout the program.

Designing Equine Therapy Programs for Individuals with Autism

With Dr. Terri Jennings, Psychologist

This course focuses on designing mounted and unmounted equine assisted activities for individuals with autism of varying ages and abilities. The instructor will demonstrate a wide array of techniques and teach how, when, and why we use them with individuals with autism.

Developing treatment goals, designing interventions and measuring progress will be linked to hands-on activities during field trips to the ranch. We will also discuss what to look for when choosing potential equine partners for working with individuals on the spectrum.

Also included in this course are in-person experiential learning opportunities in equine communication, safety, and handling.

Experiential learning can be completed at any PATH certified equine facility.

EcoBlitz is an interdisciplinary environmental education and community science program created by a team* of California-based National Geographic Explorers and National Geographic Certified Educators.

The spirit of interdisciplinary collaboration encourages students to explore plant and animal biodiversity like a biologist, and trash and plastics like an anthropologist. Students learn about their communities through the lenses of global education, geographic education, and environmental education.

Students develop the attitudes, skills, and knowledge of real National Geographic Explorers while working with other classes throughout California to create more socially just and sustainable local and global communities.

EcoBlitz is aligned to TK-12 interdisciplinary content standards such as the Common Core State Standards, California Environmental Principles & Concepts (EP & Cs), Next Generation Science Standards, and the Guidelines for Excellence series from the North American Association for Environmental Education.

Participants who are enrolled in this course and complete all required activities and deliverables will receive a digital EcoBlitz microcredential badge. Participants may also purchase two Extended Education units.

Prerequisites: None. Course participants will need access to students during this course and will be expected to facilitate an EcoBlitz during the month of May.



General Information

ACADEMIC STANDING

Students whose cumulative grade-point average is 2.0 or above are considered in good academic standing.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Students who intend to enroll in a degree program through the College of Extended Education & Global Engagement (CEEGE) must apply through the CSU admissions process. Some certificate programs also require an application. See registration procedures at humboldt.edu/extended/register.

CANCELED CLASSES

For canceled classes, full refunds for non-credit and Extension courses will be issued automatically.

CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS (CEU)

The CEU is a nationally-recognized unit of measurement for non-degree educational experiences. Some courses offer CEUs for relicensing or professional development purposes. CEU credit cannot be applied toward degrees.

CREDIT/NO CREDIT GRADING MODE

Students may opt to take some courses on a credit/no credit basis in place of a letter grade. To do so, students must complete the required form at CEEGE before half the course has elapsed.

CREDIT FOR EXTENSION COURSES

The maximum extension credit which can be accepted by Cal Poly Humboldt toward a bachelor's degree requirement is 24 units, and not more than 8 units may apply to a master's degree.

DISABILITY RESOURCE CENTER

DROP & REFUND POLICY

If for any reason, you find it impossible to complete a course for which you are registered, you must inform CEEGE by submitting a drop form, and if applicable, petition of the student form. Please allow two to four weeks to receive a refund. For refund purposes, the drop will be effective as of the date that it is received at Extended Education. See the full drop and refund policy at humboldt.edu/extended/drop.

HOLDS

Holds are placed on student accounts for any debts owed to the university, or for certain non-monetary reasons. These holds will prevent you from registering, receiving grades, and transcripts, etc.

ID NUMBERS

Cal Poly Humboldt will generate a unique nine-digit student identification number. The Humboldt ID should be used in every Cal Poly Humboldt correspondence, as a protection from identity theft.

LATE REGISTRATION

Unless otherwise specified in program literature, a \$25 late fee will be applied if registration is not received and paid prior to the second class meeting for Extension, OLLI and Special Session courses.

MATRICUL ATED STUDENTS

For the purposes of this bulletin, matriculation refers to those students who have been admitted to Cal Poly Humboldt and are eligible to register for the current semester. Graduate students needing to maintain continuous enrollment should contact the Office of Graduate Studies (707-826-3949) for guidance.

NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT

The California State University system does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, physical disability, or sexual orientation in the education programs or activities it conducts.

PRIVACY RIGHTS OF STUDENTS

The full text of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (Buckley Amendment), as amended, is on the Registrar's website (registrar.humboldt.edu/privacy). The campus is authorized under the Act to release directory information concerning students. Written requests specifying information not to be released should be sent to CEEGE.

REFUND REQUESTS

Refund checks are mailed to the student's local mailing address. Refunds should be received in two to four weeks. Credit card refunds are in the form of a credit on account.

RETROACTIVE CREDIT

Requests for retroactive credit due to extenuating circumstances will be processed for up to one calendar year after the course ends. Students will pay the registration fees and a \$25 late fee per course.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

Students are required to provide the university with their social security number (individual taxpayer identification number) pursuant to the authority contained in Section 41201, Title 5, California Code of Regulations, and Section 6109 of the Internal Revenue Code.

TAX CREDITS

Students enrolled in an eligible degree or certificate program, or who are taking courses to acquire or improve job skills, may qualify for a Hope Scholarship or Lifetime Learning Tax Credit. Consult IRS Publication 970 or a tax preparer for additional information.

VERIFICATION OF ENROLLMENT

Students who need an official verification of current enrollment may request this verification in writing from CEEGE registrar.

VETERANS
