

Mia began the Geospatial Certificate Program with a couple of intro to cartography courses and some online ESRI training.

It was not until attending Humboldt's online geospatial program that she realized just how much there is to learn; it's so much more than creating maps, and it had a huge impact on Mia's life.

Because the program is fully online, Mia was able to work as a GIS technician while she was in the program, and was immediately able to apply her newfound skills to her day-to-day work.

She is now teaching an Intro to Geospatial Concepts course, all thanks to the wealth of knowledge that she gained in the Humboldt online Geospatial Certificate Program.

"One thing that I really enjoyed about the program was how applicable all of the activities and discussions were." she says. "The instructors kept



the content relative to current events, and they were a lot of fun to complete, which is challenging for an online program. The material kept me engaged and excited for each upcoming course.

"Another thing that stood out to me was how the assignments required acquiring data from free online resources. These are the types of skills that are so helpful in becoming a GIS professional."

Sharla was working as a water resource specialist for a Northern California county and was ready for a promotion, but she did not have the required college accredited GIS certificate.

This led her to take the Cal Poly Humboldt Online Geospatial Certificate Program, and she is now a GIS analyst for her local government.

Sharla graduated with a BS in geology five years prior to beginning this program, and was intimidated not only by going back to school but also by the online aspect.


The program changed Sharla's perception of the online learning experience, as she found Humboldt's program to be well-established and orchestrated, with motivating professors and staff support.

Equine Assisted

Services & Therapies Program

The Equine Assisted Services & Therapies program is a series of experiential courses that combine online and hands-on learning in a therapeutic equine setting. The goal is to teach students in education and health related fields how to add an equine component to their work. Equine welfare, professionalism and safety are emphasized throughout the program.

Designing Equine Therapy Programs for Individuals with Autism

With Dr. Terri Jennings, Psychologist

This course focuses on designing mounted and unmounted equine assisted activities for individuals with autism of varying ages and abilities. The instructor will demonstrate a wide array of techniques and teach how, when, and, why we use them with individuals with autism.

Developing treatment goals, designing interventions and measuring progress will be linked to hands-on activities during field trips to the ranch. We will also discuss what to look for when choosing potential equine partners for working with individuals on the spectrum.


Also included in this course are in-person experiential learning opportunities in equine communication, safety, and handling. Experiential learning can be completed at any PATH certified equine facility.

Steve Engle

Steve Engle is a retired acute hospital administrator. After he saw the Introduction to Equine Assisted Services & Therapies class in the Cal Poly Humboldt Extended Education bulletin, he wanted to see this different side of horsemanship.

His years of therapeutic experience included assisting in the implementation of dog therapy in the acute hospital setting. Because he had horses, he was interested in how a horse could be included in the therapeutic environment.

Observing and participating in the therapeutic environment opened his eyes to the behavioral health possibilities for equine therapy. "It is not just limited to physical therapy," he says.

"When thinking about this course, enter with an open mind. Your experience's with horses is valuable, but can be expanded into another potential therapeutic



environment with clients or family members.

"Even if you don't use the horse in your therapeutic practice, many of the activities taught in the class can be incorporated in the outpatient setting. Listen and learn how horses can be another modality towards person-to-person communication."

Melissa Reed

Melissa Reed is the community outreach and resources coordinator for Humboldt Domestic Violence Services. and she is a current volunteer at Dr. Terri Jennings' private practice, Healing Strides.

After receiving an Extended Education bulletin in the mail, her interest was piqued by the description for the Intro to Equine Therapy course. Melissa has always been interested in animal-assisted therapy, and she is especially fascinated by horses (but never had access to them), so she decided to take the plunge!

One of the biggest takeaways that she got from the program was that you don't need to start out as an expert. Many of the other students in the class already had experience with horses, which was intimidating at first. But Dr. Terri was so helpful and enthusiastic in answering any questions that came up for Melissa.

She says, "Honestly, taking the course reminded me that I am capable of trying new things! I sometimes

struggle to get out of my comfort zone due to the fear that I might not know what I'm doing, or I might not be "good" at whatever it is I'm exploring. To others who are considering



the program: Just do it! You never know who you'll meet or what you'll learn. Plus, you get to go out and be with horses. What's not to love?"

Melissa finds her time at Healing Strides as "a great opportunity to connect with the part of me that loves to learn and enjoys a challenge — truly embodying the spirit of extended education, haha!"

Certificate in **Stem Cell Biology** & Regenerative Medicine

In this certificate program, biomedical scientists dedicated to advancing cell-based therapies will receive training in research methods, laboratory techniques, good manufacturing practices, and biomedical ethics.

They also participate in a 12-month internship at one of these outstanding collaborating host institutions: Cedars-Sinai Board of Governors Regenerative Medicine Institute, The Gladstone Institute, The Institute for Stem Cell Biology at UC Santa Cruz, the Stanford University Institute for Stem Cell Biology and Regenerative Medicine, Takeda California, and the UC Davis Stem Cell Program.



Since 2008, The California Institute for Regenerative Medicine (CIRM) has funded this program, and offers ten paid internship positions a year through its CIRM Bridges initiative. Over 100 Cal Poly Humboldt CIRM Bridges alumni are working in the field as clinicians, researchers, and/or laboratory technicians.

This includes all facets of the cannabis industry - including cultivation, distribution, lab testing, manufacturing, and retail.

Students who successfully complete this Cal/OSHA 30-hour general industry training will receive an industry-recognized Cal/OSHA 30-hour course completion card and certificate for general industry, related to these aspects of the cannabis industry.

Full attendance is mandatory for all class sessions. Failure to attend every session will result in not earning the Cal/OSHA card and certificate.

This course is presented by three local wine educators with many combined years of experience working in the wine arena.

Local winemaker and winegrower, Wil Franklin, who earned a B.S. and M.S. at Humboldt, kicks off the day with a lecture about how wine is produced starting with where it all begins — in the vineyard. Part two of Wil's presentation drills into the processes of making wine.

The next segment of the day is devoted to understanding the business side of wine. Elizabeth Hans McCrone, wine industry journalist and former public relations Cal Poly Humboldt lecturer, takes us into the complicated but fascinating world of the business of wine with a look at compliance, wholesale, direct-to-consumer, retail, and marketing.



The day will conclude with a comprehensive tasting flight with your guide, Pam Long. Pam's wine industry background includes national sales and marketing, tasting room management, and wine judging. Pam's lecture will focus on palate development.

Like much of academia, the wine courses were forced to change in 2020 due to the pandemic. So Elizabeth, Pam, and Wil developed the Sip in Place (SIP) series. Held on Zoom, the series was so successful that it continues to this day, even though sheltering in place is no longer necessary.

Elizabeth's favorite part of the SIP classes are the students, who come from all walks of life. Some students are looking to delve into a career in wine; others just want to increase their overall wine knowledge and appreciation.



"Most of the students interested in certification have a professional interest in wine," she says. "Some have used the certificate to assist them in developing their own businesses as winery owners, tasting room associates, vineyard managers, retail outlet owners, and restaurant workers.

"It's been our intention from the beginning to offer participants a well-rounded introduction to the fascinating world of wine. So far, that seems to be working, along with the added benefit of strengthening our local wine connections and community."




OLLI at Cal Poly Humboldt will again offer a unique outdoor education experience on the pristine North Coast of California.

General Information

ACADEMIC STANDING

Students whose cumulative grade-point average is 2.0 or above are considered in good academic standing.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Students who intend to enroll in a degree program through the College of Extended Education & Global Engagement (CEEGE) must apply through the CSU admissions process. Some certificate programs also require an application. See registration procedures at humboldt.edu/extended/register.

CANCELED CLASSES

For canceled classes, full refunds for non-credit and Extension courses will be issued automatically.

CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS (CEU)

The CEU is a nationally-recognized unit of measurement for non-degree educational experiences. Some courses offer CEUs for relicensing or professional development purposes. CEU credit cannot be applied toward degrees.

CREDIT/NO CREDIT GRADING MODE

Students may opt to take some courses on a credit/no credit basis in place of a letter grade. To do so, students must complete the required form at CEEGE before half the course has elapsed.

CREDIT FOR EXTENSION COURSES

The maximum extension credit which can be accepted by Cal Poly Humboldt toward a bachelor's degree requirement is 24 units, and not more than 8 units may apply to a master's degree.

DISABILITY RESOURCE CENTER

Students with verified temporary or permanent disabilities may be eligible for a variety of academic support services. For more information, please call the Student Disability Resource Center at 707-826-4678 (voice) or 707-826-5392 (TDD) or visit humboldt.edu/disability.

DROP & REFUND POLICY

If for any reason, you find it impossible to complete a course for which you are registered, you must inform CEEGE by submitting a drop form, and if applicable, petition of the student. Please allow two to four weeks to receive a refund. For refund purposes, the drop will be effective as of the date that it is received at Extended Education. See the full drop and refund policy at humboldt.edu/extended/drop.

HOLDS

Holds are placed on student accounts for any debts owed to the university, or for certain non-monetary reasons. These holds will prevent you from registering, receiving grades and transcripts, etc.

ID NUMBERS

Cal Poly Humboldt will generate a unique nine-digit student identification number. The Humboldt ID should be used in every Cal Poly Humboldt correspondence, as a protection from identity theft.

LATE REGISTRATION

Unless otherwise specified in program literature, a \$25 late fee will be applied if registration is not received and paid prior to the second class meeting for Extension, OLLI and Special Session courses.

MATRICUL ATED STUDENTS

For the purposes of this bulletin, matriculation refers to those students who have been admitted to Cal Poly Humboldt and are eligible to register for the current semester. Graduate students needing to maintain continuous enrollment should contact the Office of Graduate Studies (707-826-3949) for guidance.

NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT

The California State University system does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, physical disability, or sexual orientation in the education programs or activities it conducts.

PRIVACY RIGHTS OF STUDENTS

The full text of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (Buckley Amendment), as amended, is on the Registrar's website (registrar.humboldt.edu/privacy). The campus is authorized under the Act to release directory information concerning students. Written requests specifying information not to be released should be sent to CEEGE.

REFUND REQUESTS

Refund checks are mailed to the student's local mailing address. Refunds should be received in two to four weeks. Credit card refunds are in the form of a credit on account.

RETROACTIVE CREDIT

Requests for retroactive credit due to extenuating circumstances will be processed for up to one calendar year after the course ends. Students will pay the registration fees and a \$25 late fee per course.

SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

Students are required to provide the university with their social security number (individual taxpayer identification number) pursuant to the authority contained in Section 41201, Title 5, California Code of Regulations, and Section 6109 of the Internal Revenue Code.

TAX CREDITS

Students enrolled in an eligible degree or certificate program, or who are taking courses to acquire or improve job skills, may qualify for a Hope Scholarship or Lifetime Learning Tax Credit. Consult IRS Publication 970 or a tax preparer for additional information.

VERIFICATION OF ENROLLMENT

Students who need an official verification of current enrollment may request this verification in writing from CEEGE registrar.

VETERANS
