History and size: HSU was founded as a teacher's college in 1913. We currently have around 7,774 students.

Location: Located in Arcata, California (population 18,000), a one-hour flight or five-hour drive north of San Francisco. Our college and community atmosphere make Humboldt State one of the safest campuses on the west coast. Our beautiful location also provides plenty of opportunities for students to become involved in clubs, sports, and activities beyond the classroom. The redwood forest, home to the tallest trees in the world, is a 5 minute walk from campus, and the beaches are only a 10 minute drive.

Accreditation/ranking: HSU is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Humboldt State University consistently ranks among the top regional colleges in publications such as U.S. News and World Report, Money, Making a Difference College Guide, and Outside Magazine. The Princeton Review rates Humboldt State a Best Western College and a Green College.

Programs: HSU offers a one- or two-semester university study program, 4-year Bachelor degrees, a one-year Master of Business Administration (MBA) and 2-year graduate programs.

Majors: include Business, Biology, Computer Science, Recreation Administration, Environmental Resource Engineering, Oceanography, Education, and Art. 48 undergraduate programs and 12 graduate programs. **humboldt.edu/programs/type**

Undergraduate admission: Students must have a 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale for high school coursework, and a 2.0 GPA if they have completed college-level coursework, plus English proficiency (TOEFL 525 PBT, 71 IBT or IELTS 6.0).

Graduate admission: Students must have at least a 2.5 on a 4.0 scale (some departments require a higher GPA), plus English proficiency (TOEFL 550 PBT, 80 IBT or IELTS 6.5). Some departments have additional requirements.

HSU Study California: Students who apply to the HSU Study California program can study at HSU for one or two semesters without going through the formal admissions process. Courses taken at HSU through the HSU Study California program may appear on an official transcript and transferred to student's home university for credit.

Costs: HSU has relatively low fees when compared to other universities in California. HSU fees are located here: **extended.humboldt.edu/international-programs/prospective-students/costs**
